## **ENVIRONMENT ACTIONS**

Things you can do:

Keep pressure on local Councils to go carbon neutral by 2030, put pension funds into green energy rather than fossil fuels

Write to your M.P. about supporting measures designed to reduce greenhouse gas emissions

Cycle, walk and use public transport rather than drive – petrol and diesel vehicles cause a lot of pollution and damage peoples' health as well as contributing to global warming

Travel by train or boat rather than plane – planes create a lot of atmospheric pollution. Off-set any unavoidable plane flights by planting trees, etc.

Change to an electric car or use a car pool if driving is essential

Use a Green energy supplier

Use an environmentally friendly bank – avoid those that encourage fossil fuel extraction

Support an environmental group, (either actively or financially), such as: Greenpeace, ARocha, Surfers Against Sewage, Extinction Rebellion, your local Fossil Free group, London National Park City, etc.

Plant trees (see groups such as Trees for Life.org.uk)

Avoid plastic

Use energy efficient light-bulbs and switch them off when leaving a room

Insulate your home well - to stop heat escaping into the atmosphere

Re-use, recycle and repair clothes and other items – to reduce carbon emissions created by their production and transportation

Eat less meat and dairy – cattle emit a lot of methane and rainforests are destroyed to grow crops to feed them

Adopt a vegan diet

Calculate food portions carefully - to reduce waste which would go to landfill and give out greenhouse gases
