Drinking deep from the well of Wellbeing

Certain words and phrases become first a trendy term and then a cause for eye-rolling at meetings when they are used for the umpteenth time. Wellbeing could indeed be one of these, but nonetheless it's been chosen as a theme and priority for St Gabriel's in 2024. It's partly because, unlike many theological terms, it's instantly recognisable, and cliché or not, we all think we know roughly what it means.



For me, however, there's another purpose. I'm always curious to explore the intersection of common human experience, and religious or faith understanding. There are many habits and practices that can be seen through the lens of a secular worldview as 'good for wellbeing', that have their parallels in the world of Christian faith and viceversa. For example, it is interesting (to me at least) to see that intermittent fasting has been recently recognised to have health and wellbeing benefits long after it was part of faithful practice in a number of religions. Similarly, mindfulness and meditation are practiced both with and without a faith dimension. The Sabbath principle of rest in Judaism and reframed in Christianity have their workplace equivalent now in the principle of work-life balance and protected times for employees when they shouldn't be expected to respond to email or messages.

So, there's much common ground to explore, and mutual learning about the ways in which we can flourish as human beings in an increasingly complex and confusing world. The church, despite her long and deep traditions is often slow to draw from them, and needs to be awakened by what the world around it has (re)discovered as good for us. So, i'm very much looking forward this Lent to our church course exploring aspects of wellbeing through the lens of our deep spiritual traditions and the teachings of Jesus.


It was Jesus who said 'I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly' (John 10.10), and a second century Christian disciple Irenaeus of Lyons who spoke in similar terms: 'the Glory of God is a human being fully alive'. Whilst we may not all share the same foundational beliefs to frame our search, I believe we can all say 'amen' to that vision, and encourage one another as we seek fullness of life. As ever at St Gabriel's we actively invite fellow pilgrims, explorers or the vaguely curious to find out more about what that means for us and to share their views on life's journey. Whether at a service, at preschool playgroup, meditation or Tuesday afternoon tea and conversation, you'd be very welcome.

Christian Aid Week 2024

Save the Date This year it is from 14th to 20th May.

This year Christian Aid Week will focus on the cost of living crisis faced by many people around the world.



What happens during Christian Aid Week?

Christian Aid Week is seven amazing days of fundraising, prayer and action against global poverty. During the week, Christian Aid asks supporters to give their time, money and voices to help bring lasting change to some of the world's poorest communities. For St Gabriel's Church and friends in Aldersbrook and Lakehouse communities this means volunteers will deliver Christian Aid envelopes house to house and then collect back envelope donations. Supporters can also donate online via our Aldersbrook St Gabriel's Christian Aid link.

When did Christian Aid Week start?

In 1957, Janet Lacey, the organisation's then director, decided to hold a "Christian Aid Week" to encourage public awareness. This first event mobilised residents in 200 towns and villages across Britain, collecting £26,000 for overseas development work. In 1964 the agency changed its name to Christian Aid. For over 70 years now Christian Aid has been standing with the poorest, and now works in 37 countries with people of all faiths and none, to stand up for dignity, equality and justice.

What is Christian Aid's motto?

We stand together. For dignity. For equality. For justice. Everyone is equal in the sight of God.

It was great to see children, families, and everyone in the communities joining our Messy Church, After School Club, Sunday School and All-Age Services. Thanks to the hard work and commitments of our church volunteers and also everyone who participated. Hope you all find God's love, hope and joy in St Gabriel's.



Church hall refurbishment: progress

St Gabriel's Church Hall is a well-used and highly affordable space that provides for strong, intergenerational community use. 2023 saw the redoubling of efforts to improve the hall, with a target completion date of 2028. The work is led by Father Martyn and a group of 9 people, 4 from the congregation and 5 from the wider community.

In 2023, £16,000 was raised from a ceilidh, a local history event, a Big Give campaign, the selling of merchandise and a Friends' Scheme. Significant achievements have already included the installation of solar panels, the creation of a hospitable meeting space in the Choir Vestry, a clear-out of the upstairs area of the Hall, and a painting day involving 11 volunteers.

For 2024 the Parochial Church Council have authorised the spending of £40,000, and in the year ahead we want to pick up the pace. This is the timetable:

By the end of February half term.

- 1. Improve plumbing and repaint the Ladies loo in the Hall.
- 2. Repaint back of church loo. Paint lower walls, radiators and skirting in Hall.

By the end of the Easter Holidays

3. Cosmetically and functionally improve Gents loo. Put new flooring in Gents loo, upstairs loo and kitchen area.

By the end of The Summer holidays

4. Repair plasterwork and paint the upper walls in the Hall, and redecorate and reorganise the kitchen.

But that will exhaust funds and still leave these major works to be done:

- · Improving storage by reworking the stage and associated areas.
- · Improving access to the rear garden.
- · Replacing cladding and the Hall ceiling.
- · Rendering the Hall more environmentally sustainable.

Richard Pratley has worked tirelessly to design improvements and obtain planning permission and specialist advice. We have adapted to escalating costs. The work can be done in phases over the next three years. **But we still need to raise £350,000.**






