A church for the community

When I arrived in Aldersbrook, now coming up for 12 years ago I came to a church that largely did its thing and invited people from within and without to participate. It was warm and welcoming but it was the church offering something that others could take or leave. That had been the way of the church of England for many generations. But, in recent times, and in accelerating fashion, the church has become not the thing to be part of, but at best a thing to be part of, and for many an increasing irrelevance.



My own implicit understanding of church has been influenced by the fact that I spent some of my earliest years living in a community. Our family was part of a group of at one point nearly 100 people living in a disused monastery in the heyday of Christian commune living in the 70s. It was by no means a perfect upbringing, and I'm sure a therapist could help me understand many of my current 'issues' from that experience! But, one thing that has stayed with me is the value of each other: I can't become the best me without relationships, which help me to grow, learn and love more.

I think that's true in so many spheres of life, and I think it's true for our society as well. I believe the church has something to offer in that exchange, but I think it also has much to learn and receive as well through deep and rich encounter with others different to ourselves. As the many and varied events in church recently have shown, there are lots of ways of gathering people together: to create community, build friendships, and also raise funds for what we hope is a true community resource that people have so generously supported. (We're always open to new ideas as well, just get in touch!)

One of the most beautiful things I heard recently was when someone (not a regular churchgoer) corrected themselves after making a comment about 'your church', to saying with a bit of a smile 'oh, it's actually our church isn't it?'. If we could truly reach the point where everyone could see the truth of the Spanish saying 'mi casa es su casa' when speaking about St Gabriel's then we'd know we are no longer an irrelevance but a meaningful part of life here in Aldersbrook.

Turkey and Syria Earthquake Appeal As we know, a devastating 7.8 magnitude earthquake has struck south-eastern Turkey near the border with Syria, followed by a series of powerful aftershocks. This is the deadliest and most powerful recorded earthquake to hit Turkey in decades and many thousands of men, women and children have died or are injured.

But even before this devastating earthquake, there were over four million people in need of aid in Northwest Syria. 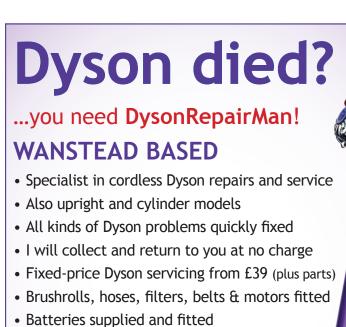
